- “Feminists Are Getting Sterilized to Protest Trump Becoming President” (NY Post, 12/24). How childish and arrogant. As if procreation is a bargaining tool. As if we care. This may be a culmination of the feminist “4 B Movement”—no marriage, no childbirth, no dating, no sex. Hmm...I guess if that gains traction, there would be no need for abortion “rights.”
- “Pastors Hold Ceremony to Bless Abortion Clinic” (LifeNews, 12/24). It’s disgusting, of course, but as arguments used to justify abortion fall like dominoes as medical science progresses, the abortion industry grasps at straws to legitimize its barbaric practice.
